The Saints

Hebrew – chacyid = godly ones Greek – hagios = holy ones

To be called a saint means to share in the Holy Spirit.

In the Bible there is no such thing as a singular saint. Saints is always used in the plural.

We are saints, the godly ones who have received both the Holy Spirit and the mission of God to make disciples.

John 20:21-22 (ESV)

Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit."

Matthew 28:18-20 (ESV)

And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
